MLDMHI has stated in its mission that the institute wants to create health care providers who can deliver holistic care in all corners of the country. Effective delivery of holistic care is based on the scientific principles. Therefore, institute has given for evidence-based medicine. The focus of training for research has also been valuing evidences for all the actions.

MLDMHI has established a separate Department of Research to promote the research which naturally based on evidence. As a part of promoting research, institute has created a number of special homoeopathic OPDs like Hypertension, Pulmonology, Endocrine, Psychiatry, dermatology, Pediatrics etc. In these special OPDs the student get the understands the types of evidences and its importance. Some students take up either pilot study or researchproject for their dissertations. Teachers from these OPDs along with the Research department guide the students in their research work. The research training is also done in field, where students are posted in the rural OPDs for 3 months. There the students has opportunity to conduct community based survey.

Research department also conducts interdepartmental scientific meetings for deciding the areas in which the students, faculty or the departments would take up the project. It provides a open platform for discussing innovative ideas and then the decisions are taken on the basic of FINER criteria.

Research department conducts in-house special training for interested Part 2 PG residents to train them as "Junior Research Fellows". During these 9 months training they take up small research project under joint guidance of subject expert and the research department.

Institute has subscribed prominent research journals and has separate library which students can access. For the statistical analysis Research department has SPSS24 software.

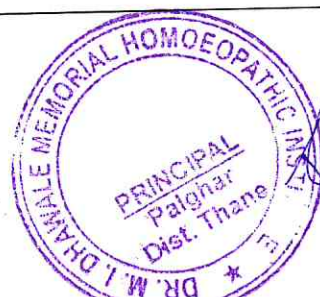

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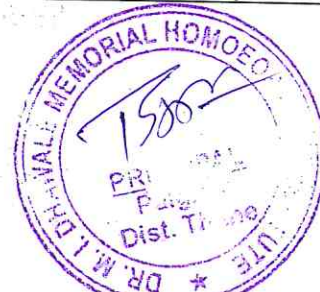
