



What is Repertory?

It is an index of symptoms. Arranged systematically. The system of arrangement may be founded on definite guiding principles, or it may be alphabetical or schematic.

Purpose of Repertory?

- To serve as a reference/guide in looking up particular symptom that may indicate a similimum or that may make the necessary distinction between two or more similar remedies
- b) A careful study of all symptoms appearing in the chronic case.

Value of Repertory depends on several elements:

- a) Art of case taking
- b) Knowledge of repertory one attempts to use
 - i. The philosophical background
 - ii. The construction
 - iii. Its limitations
 - iv. Its adaptability


